He was a renowned defender of the Constitution and property rights. To the best of Wikipedia's knowledge, Story County, Iowa is the only County in the United States names after him.

Last month's guests included Gannon Hendrick, Legislative Analyst at the Iowa Senate, Story County Treasurer Renee Twedt, and Ty Stewart, Candidate for Story County Auditor.

Gannon advises the Senate Republican Caucus on all education related legislation. He works with members of the Iowa Legislature to formulate policy that meets their intent, provides constituent support, and works with lobbyists representing a variety of interests as they relate to education policy issues.

Gannon said that Education Reform is the #1 priority, followed by Tax Reform and Health care issues.

Renee Twedt spoke about the upcoming Story County Freedom Flight in October, which will transport Story County Veterans to Washington, D.C. They now have 200 applications and \$55,000 on hand, with a goal of raising \$95,000 for the flight.
